DAY ONE

God is the eternal Creator.

• Read Isaiah 46:3-4; Isaiah 45:18; Genesis 14:22; and Romans 1:20.

Have you ever wondered who made God? If so, the answer is: no one! God is eternal. He is everlasting and He is unchanging. There is no other god like Him. Only He holds the power to create, sustain, and rescue. Yet, lowly as we are, He has revealed Himself to us! We have the joy and privilege to know the living God. God's attributes reveal His divine nature and power so that we can see Him and know His character.

DAY TWO

There is no one like the all-powerful God.

• Read Isaiah 46:5-7; Isaiah 45:5-7; Romans 11:33-34; and Psalm 147:5.

Many things in the world will try to compete for the place of God. Perhaps there are even idols within your own life which threaten to steal your affections away from the Lord. We were all created to worship, but the question is, *Who* were we made to worship? If you answered God, you are right! Only God is worthy of our worship because only He is the one true God. No worthless idol could ever compare to an all-powerful, all-knowing God who loves us!

Are there any idols in your life that might be competing for God's rightful place? Remember that idols are not just brazen statues, but anything we put above or in place of God, like pride (self-worship), praise from others, lust for popularity, being an ideal student, and so forth.

DAY THREE

God calls us to remember who He is and what He has done.

• Read Isaiah 46:8-9; Deuteronomy 5:15; and Psalm 105:5.

Sometimes we can be very forgetful. Even remembering what our parents just reminded us to do can be hard sometimes. As we are easily distracted or busy with life, we can also begin to forget the God of the Bible. We prioritize other things over Him or we fail to stay committed to reading His Word. God knows that we can easily forget that He has done great things for us. There is nothing in our lives that compares to God. We must make it a daily practice to spend time with God and His Word so that our hearts can recall the truths about Him. When we remember

who God is and what He has done, we are reminded to trust in Him for all things.

DAY FOUR

God is sovereign.

 Read Isaiah 46:10-11; Matthew 19:26; Psalm 119:68; Numbers 23:19; and Ezekiel 12:28.

Sovereign isn't a word we use in our everyday vocabulary. If we lived long ago or in a country with a king or queen, sovereign might be more relevant to us. Essentially, sovereign means "supreme ruler with absolute power." There is no limit to what God can do, and whatever He says He will do, He does. Because God is truth and He is good, all that He does is also true and good. Therefore, we can trust that God rules the world rightly. Additionally, God keeps His promises. His sovereign reign includes the truth that what He has promised will actually be done. He does not leave us with empty promises, but acts sovereignly to fulfill the truth of His Word.
